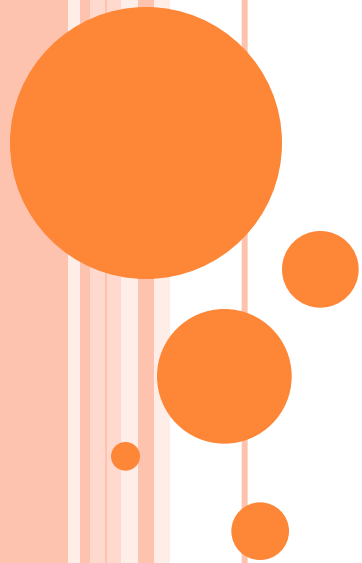

We invest funds through the Winnipeg Foundation.

We donate the revenues back to charities and groups in Pinawa *(at least 3.5% of endowed funds each year)*.

Do not use professional fundraisers.

Do not solicit by phone or door-to-door.

Do not use any of your donation for administration costs.

Do not donate to anyone outside of Pinawa.

Do not sell or trade your name/address.

Do not pay high management fees for investments (< 1%).



2017-2018 Highlights

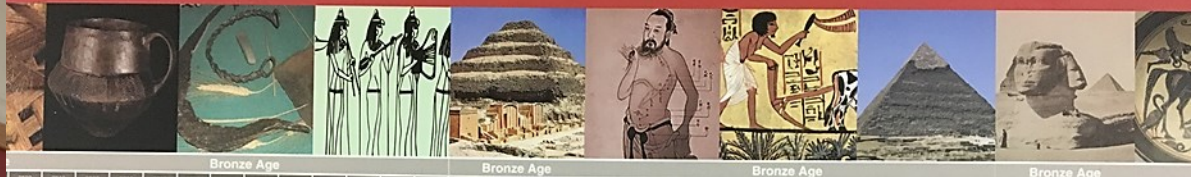

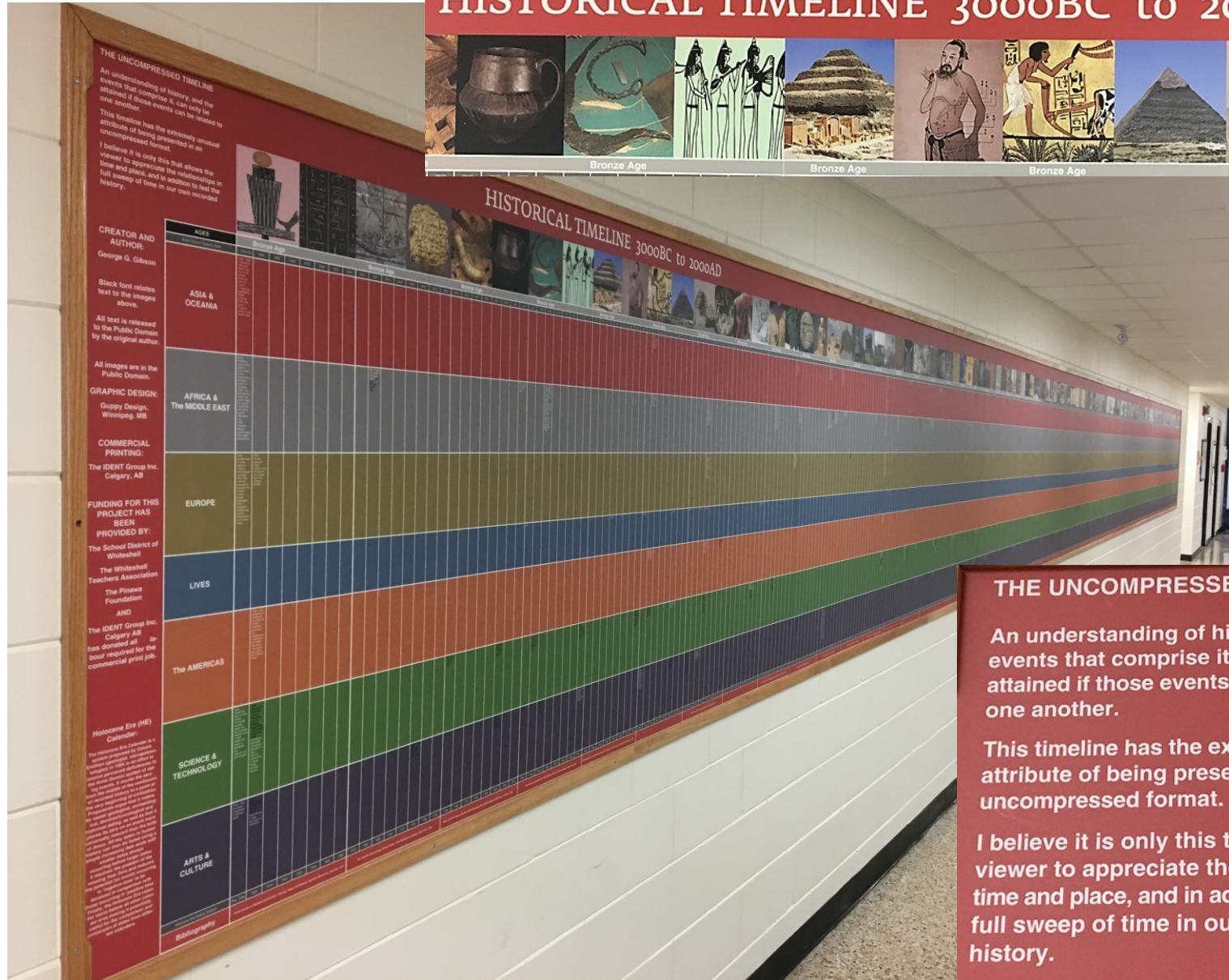

Pinawa's Mayors: Har In Ry, Len Simpson, Lorne Swanson and Blair Skinner

Pinawa has had five mayors up to 2017, with 32 residents being elected as councillors. Blair Skinner has been the longest serving mayor, holding the office for over 10 years. The community has had seven administrators, with Gary Hanna serving the longest at 23 years.

Peter Taylor began a one year adventure in Canada in 1972. Peter and Sharon moved to Pinawa in 1975. Peter has become well known in Manitoba for his expertise and love of birding. He has spent the past 35 years involved with Pinawa's Christmas Bird Count, an annual event started in 1964 by Bruce Stewart. Asked to describe highlights of his birding tours, Peter described seeing the California Condor in the mid-1980s. He is also excited to see rare birds in Manitoba, such as the Curve-Billed Thrasher and the Painted Bunting.

Alice Chambers (nee Loewen; 1937-1999) arrived in Pinawa in 1968. Alice became best known as an environmental activist, a virtual one-woman research institute. Her way was not a noisy demonstration, but meticulous digging for information. It was a credit to this small, gentle woman with the twinkle in her eye and devastatingly accurate facts that those on both sides of the table grew to respect her. Former Premier Gary Filmon said of her: "She has been the voice of the people, and a strong clear voice for nature." Alice put all her energy into furthering the cause of conservation.

The Pinawa Players, established in 1964, have presented over 100 plays to both local and provincial audiences. The Players also play an active role in community activities such as participating in the annual Birthday Weekend Parade, sponsoring an annual carol sing helping with school productions.

Jane Sargent (1944-2015) was an active volunteer in Pinawa. Jane had a long-term involvement in the Pinawa Players. Her specialties were makeup and costumes, but she pitched in where needed. She also served as Treasurer for many years.

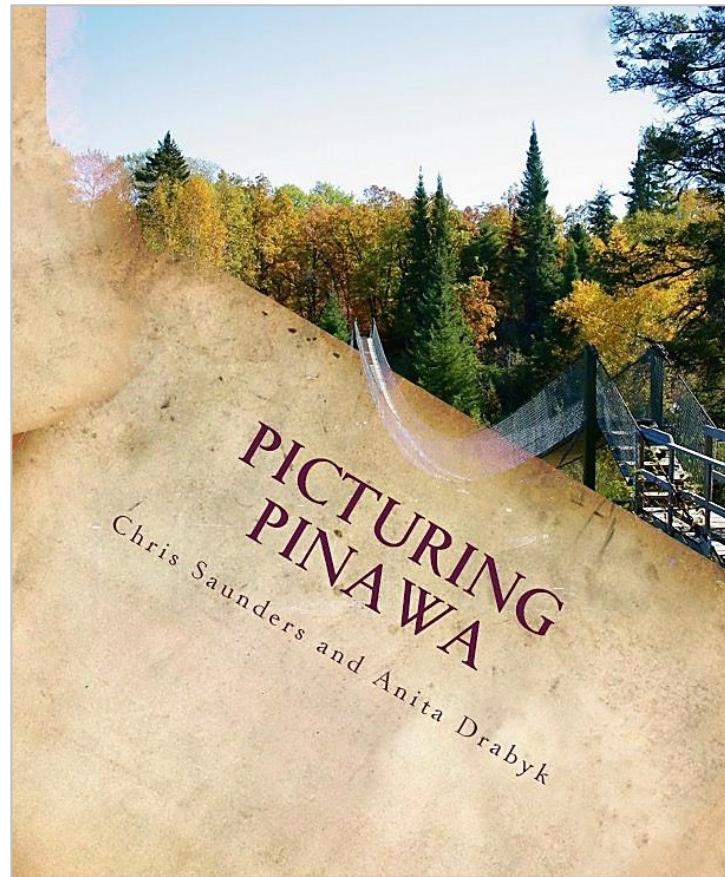
